

Religion – Third Grade Syllabus

Overall focus.

The students will learn about and celebrate the Church. They will study the seasons of the Church, the feasts in the Church, the lives of the Saints, and discipleship. The students will learn the prayers said during the Mass, and the practices of discipleship..

Each lesson begins with a question that relates to the student's experiences. Next, the student is introduced to Sacred Scripture that reinforces the faith concept in his/her daily life. The student will connect his/her faith to these experiences. Finally, the student will learn the qualities of discipleship, living as Jesus did, and practice these habits and virtues.

Chapter focus.

They will enjoy telling and acting out stories from the Bible.

They will get a greater understanding of the Gospel.

They will learn and understand the prayers they will learn.

They will learn the “acts of kindness” are part of daily living.

They will learn that participating in community service is part of the living Church.

In Class.

We will learn new prayers, sing songs, act out the Gospel readings, and create projects that will deepen our faith and understanding of the Church and what it means to be a Catholic.

Assessment will be based on participation in class, completion of projects done in class, quizzes throughout the chapter, and a test at the end of the chapter. A review of the new notes given daily should be reviewed daily.
